From the moment I opened the book, I was drawn in by the art and the vibrant colors on the pages, but soon discovered that the story itself was just as exciting.

The illustrations definitely set the overall mood for each scene, and switching from color for Finder's storyline to black-and-white for Seymour Warts' storyline is such a great touch.

This graphic novel is **full of adventure** as Finder stumbles on a mystery that she wasn't expecting, and later as her friends try to find her after discovering that she is 'missing.'

The puns sprinkled throughout the book are hilarious, and make sure to look closely at the details on each of the pages – nestled among the amazing illustrations are more puns and fun tidbits. The weaving of the story through both the written words and the graphics is just downright brilliant.

This story will draw kids in and keep them both entertained and fully engrossed in the mystery.

MISSION: TOGETHER

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How our books came to be: We were both already writing. Kevin found an unpublished book his father had written, which he finished in honor of his dad's legacy as an English literature professor. That's how he started. We came together conceptually when Kevin had a dream, saw a series of books on a shelf, with the same name on the spines - P. Knuckle Jones was born.

Why they are doing what they are doing: It is in our DNA. Kevin's dad was a writer, Rebecca's grandmother could tell a yarn that you would never believe was true. Instead of bringing candy from travels away, Rebecca's dad brought books - well above her grade level, yet she devoured them (*The World According to Garp* in when she was nine!). Kevin's uncle was a creative and author and Rebecca's uncle was also a creative. Writing books was understood on top of anything else they were doing (working, degrees, parenting, dogs, dinner - in other words - daily survival). Both, as kids (and adults), loved Scooby Doo, The Hardy Boys, the Boxcar Children and R.L.Stine. We wanted to write mysteries from the get-go, but the fevered dream about P. Knuckle was the impetus.

What makes us special in the children's book category: When we were both kids at the book fairs, hundreds of miles apart - one in Houston, one in San Antonio, we were both unsatisfied with the books that were offered. Rebecca wanted the boys' books: bold characters, unafraid, mysterious and scary. Kevin wanted a challenge and sometimes rewrote the endings. We hope that our books satisfy/challenge kids to discover the clues, making kids more invested in the characters.

What are we doing that our competitors aren't: We are both educators at our core. Through our research we always tie our work into real-world implications and scenarios, trying to solve a problem. For example, *problem:* why are young girls dropping out of STEM areas of study at an early age? *Solution:* write about a young female scientist or detective to normalize these opportunities in young readers' minds. We seek to inspire future authors and illustrators to be passionate about books with a mission by working with teachers and librarians to fuel this drive.

Are we creating a new category? Yes. We want to create books with cool stories and graphics without screaming "learning is happening in this book!" The hope is that we provide a resource that connects teachers and librarians with learning objectives about comprehension, story building narratives, cause and effect, consequences, etc. We want to partner with teachers and librarians and make their work a tiny bit easier while turning kids into future authors and learners. It's a win-win. We know other authors work with schools to encourage learning and comprehension, but our books (we hope) are about the story first, the mystery, the creative problem solving, etc. that just happen to align with opportunities for extended learning beyond the story. We write books with three pillars of communication: magic, creativity and community.
